PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE GUIDE

Recommended care practices | Acrylic court & recreational surfaces

ROUTINE CARE	CLEANING	INSPECTION
KEEP CLEAN Remove leaves, dirt and debris regularly	MILD SOAP + WATER Use soft-bristle tools and rinse thoroughly	CHECK REGULARLY Address cracks, drainage or wear early

1. Routine Cleaning

Keep the surface free of leaves, dirt, sand, food, gum and other debris. Sweep with a soft-bristle broom or use a blower. Do not allow organic debris to remain for long periods because it can hold moisture and contribute to staining or biological growth.

2. Washing the Surface

For general cleaning, use clean water with a mild, non-abrasive detergent. Apply with a soft-bristle brush or mop and rinse thoroughly. Test any cleaner in a small, inconspicuous area first.

3. Avoid Harsh Cleaning Methods

Do not use harsh solvents, strong chemicals, abrasive cleaners, wire brushes or aggressive pressure washing. These can damage the acrylic coating, alter texture or cause premature wear.

4. Drainage & Standing Water

Keep drains, edges and surrounding areas clear. Inspect after rainfall for recurring puddles or drainage problems. Remove standing water when practical and evaluate persistent drainage concerns.

5. Cracks, Wear & Surface Damage

Inspect periodically for cracking, peeling, delamination, excessive wear or equipment damage. Address small concerns early. Contact CSP Sports & Rec if an area may require professional evaluation.

6. Use & Surface Protection

Use the surface only for its intended purpose. Do not drag benches, goals, tables or heavy objects across the coating. Protect it from sharp edges, vehicle traffic, fuel, oil and materials that may stain, gouge or soften the surface.

7. Snow & Ice

Use plastic shovels or equipment with non-metallic edges. Avoid metal blades, chains or methods that can scrape the coating. Confirm compatibility before using deicing products.

8. Periodic Professional Review

High-use facilities should consider periodic professional inspection for wear patterns, drainage concerns and areas that may benefit from repair or re-coating. Re-coating timing varies with traffic, climate, maintenance and site conditions.

IMPORTANT Proper maintenance helps preserve appearance and performance. It does not correct underlying pavement movement, structural cracking, drainage defects or other sub-base conditions.

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MAINTENANCE CHECKLIST

A simple record for routine inspections and care

AREA TO REVIEW	WHAT TO LOOK FOR	RECOMMENDED ACTION
Surface cleanliness	Leaves, sand, dirt, stains, gum	Sweep/blow; mild soap and water as needed
Drainage	Puddles, clogged drains, blocked edges	Clear debris; document recurring ponding
Cracks	New or expanding cracks	Photograph and evaluate promptly
Coating condition	Peeling, flaking, worn color or texture	Avoid further damage; request evaluation
Lines & markings	Fading or excessive wear	Plan touch-up/re-coating when needed
Perimeter	Vegetation, soil, irrigation overspray	Trim/adjust to keep surface clear
Equipment	Sharp feet, dragging, rust or leaks	Use protective pads; repair equipment
